Purpose of the job

The Trust Lead Practitioner of Mathematics is part of the Trust's School Improvement Team and will work with the Director of Mathematics to improve the quality of education in the teaching of mathematics across the secondary academies in the Trust.

Some travel between the academies is part of the role. In addition to supporting improvements at KS3 and KS4, the post holder may be involved in supporting the teaching of mathematics post 16.

Main Duties and Responsibilities

- to promote and be committed to Laidlaw Schools Trust aims and objectives
- to support the development of improvement strategies in mathematics for all pupils
- to promote and be committed to securing high expectations for learning and the raising of achievement in all our academies

To assist the Director of Mathematics with the delivery of subject improvement plans and the raising of achievement in maths in our different academies via:

- the delivery of effective teaching and impactful interventions in designated departments/ classes/groups across academies
- provision of workshops or targeted support for targeted groups of pupils
- assessment, moderation, feedback and reporting in line with the improvement plans
- modelling of high-quality teaching in all aspects of mathematics
- support for the development of curriculum planning and related high quality teaching materials
- supporting teachers via coaching, team teaching and bespoke professional development
- contribution to Trust review, monitoring and evaluation processes
- contributing to professional development activities as part of the Trust school improvement offer
- supporting Early Career Teacher provision and support where required
- supporting post 16 mathematics
- contributing to wider Trust school improvement and training activity





To maintain the highest standards of professional practice:
